We held eleven different services over a three day period. We had over 200 public professions for Christ. The inmates and families are still talking about the blessing the revival was. We were able to bring in singers. The Baker Trio, Chaplain Baker's wife and two oldest girls, sang in the ladies pods. The Baker Boys came in and sang in the men's pods. The inmates enjoyed the singing and expressed their appreciation. We were also allowed to bring in some refreshments to the inmates.
